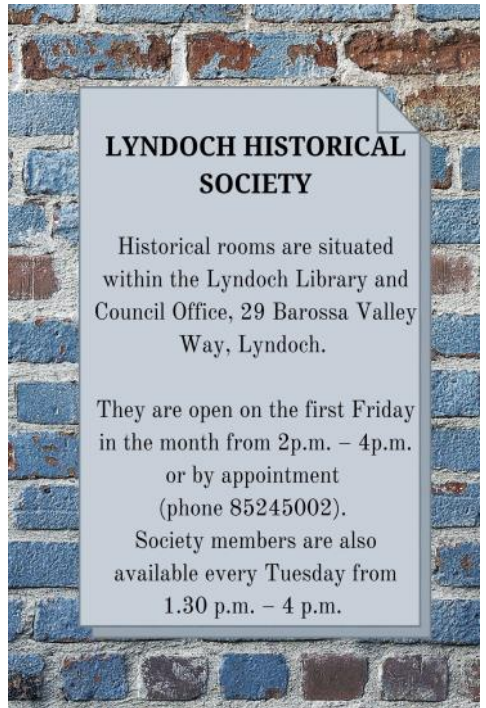

LYNDOCH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The next meeting of the Lyndoch Historical Society will be held on Sunday 4th August at 2.00 p.m. in the Meeting Room at the rear of the Lyndoch Library. Continuing the World War theme the topic will revert back 85 years to 1939 when WWII commenced. It will provide the opportunity to discover what Lyndoch was like then.

The residents of Lyndoch would have been most concerned about the robbery that had taken place shortly before war was declared. On 24th August 1939 The Leader reported that *at Mr Fiebig's store three petrol pumps were burst open and at Lyndoch Hotel the bar was entered and £2/3/6 was taken as well as tobacco and wine valued at £5/16/9. The police believe the thieves travelled in a Morris 8/40 car stolen in Adelaide the previous night.* At the Lyndoch Hotel a side window was forced to gain entry probably made between 8p.m. and 7.30 a.m. Two Semaphore men involved were apprehended and charges laid in October with both being sentenced.



With the War in mind the usual groups became organised. Lyndoch was quick to form a Red Cross Circle on 21st September 1939 with Mrs Moran being the first president, Mrs Watson secretary and Mrs Cameron, treasurer

By 8th December 1939 a Fighting Forces Comfort Fund (FFCF) had been formed at Lyndoch with Mrs L. Moran as leader, Mrs R. Watson, secretary and Mrs G. Foster, treasurer.

The Lyndoch & District Bowling Club was voted to be established in July 1984. The club entered a second division team in the Barossa & Light competition in the 1984-1985 season. During this period without a green, Lyndoch was offered the use of the Tanunda facilities. Hopefully their 40th Anniversary year will be a successful one.

The Rose Brooks Wildlife Sanctuary



A very longstanding project of the team at Barossa Wildlife Rescue (BWR) has been the establishment of a wildlife sanctuary to house animals that have been rescued and rehabilitated. Many are unsuitable to be released back into the bush and in some cases (such as with kangaroos) it is illegal to do so.

The sanctuary is dedicated as a tribute to all the wild souls who share our world and as part of our founder Rose Brooks' incredible legacy of lifelong commitment to wildlife. BWR is proud to christen the facility the "Rose Brooks Wildlife Sanctuary."



Volunteers from Weber Barbecues Australia/New Zealand, Arborgreen, Barossa Pavilions, and the 1st Armoured Regiment - Australian Army, assisted the BWR volunteers in planting trees.

"We are thrilled to see such strong community support for our greening initiative" remarked Greg Linke, Chair of Barossa Wildlife Rescue. "Planting these 400 native plants is not just about beautifying the landscape; it's about restoring habitats for our precious wildlife."

BWR is grateful to Barossa Pavilion's owner, Karl Roth, for allowing them to use part of his property for the sanctuary and to WIRES for generous funding through their national grants program.

At the time of printing, the sanctuary is awaiting some final touches before the animals move in.

The team also thanks Barossa Nursery and The Barossa Bushgardens for donating trees and shrubs, and to Aborgreen for providing tree guards.
