

LYNDOKH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The next meeting of the Historical Society will be held on Sunday 27th October at 2.00 p.m. in the meeting room at the rear of the Lyndoch Library.

The occasion will mark the 40th Anniversary of establishment of the Lyndoch Historical Society and reminisce about the achievements that have been made since the inaugural meeting held on 31st October 1984.

Continuing with Arbor Day activities held annually by schools, the Lyndoch Public School was involved 90 years ago on 3rd August 1934. The local paper explained how *the children marched to the Tanunda road where 30 Carob Trees were planted in holes previously prepared by parents at a working bee the preceding Saturday. After planting the trees, the children were addressed by the chairman of the school committee (Rev C.W.L. Noon). Gifts of sweets and fruits were made by the ladies of the committee to each child; and after saluting the flag the children were granted a half-holiday by the chairman.*

Rev Noon was keen to have Carob trees planted from the start of the Tanunda Road up to the Anglican Church so that parishioners could walk to church in the shade. In 1936 a further 40 Carob trees were planted along the same road – *this completing an avenue of trees from Lyndoch to the Church of England Rectory. A "Tiger" in the work was Rev C.W. Noon, who as chairman of the school committee, had previously dug the holes and erected the guards. The trees too were grown from seedlings by Rev Noon. Each tree was planted by two children, thus every child in the school participated in the work. Afterwards the scholars were granted a half holiday.*



LYNDCH RECREATION PARK HISTORY

THE COMMUNITY'S PARK

The need for a community recreation ground was determined by the people of Lyndoch. On 20th September 1894 a meeting was held in the Travellers' Rest Hotel attended by Rev Brooksbank and Messrs D. Nicholas, C. Juncken, H. Kennedy, W., A., and E. Springbett where it was decided to lease 9 acres from the South Australian Company for 14 years at an annual rental of 1/- and this was renewed for a further 5 years. The first trustees were Dr Richter, and Messrs Nicholas, Juncken, Mitchell and W. Springbett.

In 1911 the SA Company offered the Park Committee the opportunity to purchase the property at £15 per acre. When the lease was up in 1913 a £5 deposit was paid with the balance of the money being met by donations from the residents of Lyndoch and a fancy dress football carnival.

At the District Council of Barossa Meeting on 18th August 1913 the minutes recorded that Council *agreed to accept land and affix Council to the trust deed. An indenture for the purchase was signed on 1st September 1913, the property being Lot 22 Pt Section 535, Hundred of Barossa.*

A Committee of Management was elected annually with the inaugural committee consisting of Messrs D. Nicholas, H. Klauber, H. Kennedy, E. Springbett, A. Crambrook, E.J. Filsell, F.A. Menzel, J.E. Linke, A. Springbett, and G.C. Randall. The property was assessed at £100 for rating purposes.

The term "Barossa" hasn't ever been associated with the Lyndoch Park that is currently being re-developed. The word "Barossa" is a regional term that refers to a large area. Thanks to the action of past Lyndoch residents a sports' facility was secured that belongs to the local community and needs to recognise the town of Lyndoch in the site name.

ADVANCED RESUSCITATION – SAAS TRAINING AT LYNDOCH

Lyndoch CFS Crews had a busy night training with an Ambulance Officer from SAAS. We were fortunate to have Laura from SA Ambulance arrange a training night and bring one of the fleet vehicles up for CFS members to gain equipment familiarisation, use of the stretcher, spinal board and how to assist with casualty care and loading them onto a stretcher with the use of the casualty drag sheet.

Members also went through the procedure of Advanced Resus to carry out Airway Management, CPR and assisting Paramedics at incidents. Training like this is invaluable and ensures that our skills are up to date, and ready to assist our community when called upon.

A few days after this training, members from Lyndoch Crews used their skills to assist Paramedics at an incident and it just shows how well the training paid off.....



Well done to all the CFS members who have attended the recent courses to increase their skill level, being Basic Firefighting, Tactical Command, Road Crash Rescue, Defensive Fire Suppression, Pumps and Pumping, First Aid and Advanced Resus.

Well done to all the members for dedicating many hours to keep the Community Safe.

In 2023-24 the Lyndoch Crews attended 107 Incidents, volunteering 4,234 hours of hours given during Emergency Response, plus thousands of hours in weekly training.
