Third Generation Barber

Welcome to the "Third Generation Barber".

In the little building next to 'Violet's Pantry' on Queen Street, Williamstown, a new business has popped up! The 'Third Generation Barber" has arrived to provide Men's cuts and fades and is open -

Tuesday/Wednesday/Friday from 10am - 5pm

Thursday 11am – 7pm/Saturday 9am – 2pm

Closed Sunday and Monday.

The Third Generation barber is actually Chelsea, eleven years an Australian, but originally a New Zealander from Wellington, who grew up amongst her family's Hair Salons, unwittingly soaking up an attachment to the occupation whilst sweeping the salon floors from a very early age.

Chelsea's oma, Maureen, started the first, very successful salon, the "Hair Craft Centre", in Tawa, twenty minutes travel time from Wellington, and is still working aged seventy-seven! Mother Tanya had a Barber's shop and Hair Salon on the Kapiti Coast, forty minutes from Wellington!

After a very interesting journey to get here, Chelsea has "closed the circle" by opening her Barber's shop in Williamstown, South Australia!

Chelsea started her working life washing dishes in a Retirement Home in New Zealand at the age of fourteen. She then moved into Diversional Therapy and after that into Palliative Care, which she continued in for a while when she moved across to Australia, then opting to become a Barista, a line of work she had also pursued in New Zealand. In 2013 she became a Coffee Trainer for the quite famous Bracegirdle's business.

Chelsea's time wasn't totally devoted to work, however, and in 2015, at a Festival in Adelaide, she met Brooke, a teacher, and the pair were married in 2018 at Clarendon.

In 2017 Chelsea took an Introductory, and then a Master Class, at the Australian Radio School, training with Sean Craig Murphy of 107SAFM fame. Her deep feel for radio work took her to Lajamanu, a community of 1500 people, 540kms southwest of Katherine, then to the Daly River and eventually Darwin, Hot 100 and Mix 104.9, where she worked as a panel operator. By 2019 she was doing 'Live Crosses', outside broadcasts reporting on activities around the city.

Whilst doing her radio work Chelsea was also employed at the new Catholic Mother Theresa School as an SSO, working in inclusion support. Brooke, at the time, was also at a beautiful school -the Good Sheperd Lutheran School in Darwin.

Returning to Adelaide in 2021, Chelsea did some soul searching whilst recovering, over a six-to-eight-week period, from a right knee reconstruction and decided that the time had come to take up the barbering family tradition. She studied at the Barbery Academy and moved on to Clip Joint!

Looking to branch out on her own, Chelsea and Brooke took a massive drive around and about and found Chelsea's Dream Shop - in Williamstown!

She has great plans for the décor - minimalistic, a black and white photo wall yet a retention of the historical atmosphere of the building. So, her message is 'Gentlemen – Come on down, have a look, meet Chelsea and Chelsea "will keep you looking fresh!"

It is also worth noting that Chelsea played soccer in New Zealand for 14 years – hence the knee reconstruction! She is also musically gifted being a self-taught guitar player. As a player of the cajon drum (one you sit on and beat the section by your legs) Chelsea has accompanied solo friends in Pub gigs as well as taking part in performances in Rundle Mall and Open Mic. Nights everywhere.

A friendly, cheerful and relaxing young lady to be around, Chelsea is a great listener as well as someone, I think, who may have a host of great stories to tell too!

Rick Lane - Barossa Councillor

Convincingly elected in 2022 as a Barossa Councillor, Rick Lane is halfway through his first term in office. Inspired by the good representation of previous councillors from our local Williamstown area, people like Margaret Harris, Russell Johnstone, Bim Lange, Rebecca Tappert and Carla Weisse-Smith, Rick has always felt the pull of community, enjoyed it's many benefits while supporting it in varied ways over the years. As a Councillor, a privileged role in Rick's eyes, he has the opportunity and the challenge to do even more for his community. When asked what he actually does as a councillor Rick simplified his role by saying that he was like a liaison officer – listening to his community and presenting their views to Council, while at the same time, keeping abreast of council policies, issues and decisions then relaying and explaining these, in turn, to his local community.

He has enjoyed being involved with the huge Barossa Park Development at Lyndoch which will bring so many different sports together under the same umbrella: with the development of the Reservoirs and the use of that land for walking trails: and the journey of the Williamstown Supermarket! Apart from the monthly meetings which involve the discussion of Council's Big Issues – infrastructure, rates, etc. Rick and his fellow councillors attend Workshops where guest speakers bring them up to speed with information on issues which are to be voted on in the near future. One of the things that impressed me about Rick Lane, was his mindset, the fact that whatever he takes on, he prepares himself for incredibly well, but he also continues to learn whilst on task. He is, to coin an over-worked phrase, a true 'Life-long Learner' and he brings a great deal to the table!

Rick's family has owned the house, which is now his, since 1885 and varying branches of the family have always lived in it. During the Covid shutdowns Rick made his childhood home truly his family home by "deconstructing and upgrading" it, a task which he found to be great fun and very satisfying. A pupil at Williamstown Primary School from 1979 to 1986 and then Birdwood High School from 1987 until 1991, Rick then spent the next two years working at Orlando using a forklift, and his own muscles, to load containers for export to the UK. Eventually, he decided he needed to move on and went back to school at Nuriootpa High in 1994 to achieve the necessary University score to do a four-year teaching course in Physical Education. In 1999, he was appointed to Whyalla High School where he worked until 2002. During his time here Rick would observe students who appeared to be out of sync, and he felt the urge to help them with their problems - which he did!

This was the catalyst which, after marrying in the January of 2003 Forreston lass, Lauren Randell (now an accountant), whom he first met in 1987 at Birdwood High School, led him to apply for a job in London which, unsurprisingly, nobody else wanted but Rick!! The difficult job entailed working with dysfunctional orphaned boys at the Barnardos Charity in South London, and suffice to say, Rick survived his year there tackling the observing, learning, bonding and advising with, I suspect, patience, determination and a sense of humour. This job, in turn, eventually led Rick to the Well-Being portfolio he carries today. During this year Lauren was working in temporary administrative jobs which meant that she and Rick could enjoy filling in every holiday break with travelling to as many foreign places as possible, including Turkey, Greece, Morocco, Egypt, Sweden, Africa, New York and throughout Europe.

Returning to Whyalla in 2004 the couple stayed for two years before returning to Williamstown after an absence of 10 years. Rick said this felt "so good"! In 2006 Rick went to work as a P.E. teacher for the Catholic Education system at Thomas More College, Salisbury Downs, where he continued to work until the end of 2012. During this time Lauren and Rick became parents to daughter, Macy, in 2006 and son, Soul, in 2008.

Both children were hearing impaired but found the environment at the St. Jakobi School suited them well. To quote Rick – "Lauren's and my commitment to our kids learning and socialisation was a

priority in the early days. Plenty of books read daily, regular hearing appointments and auditory verbal therapy sessions in the city at the Cora Barclay centre. We were strong committed parents that's for sure. We had to be!"

In 2011 Rick spent a year at Beafield Education Centre which endeavours to re-engage students who have challenging behaviour problems with their learning. After a final year in 2012 at the Thomas More school, Rick returned to the State Education system in 2013 to Nuriootpa High School as a School Counsellor. Rick is currently the full time Well-being Leader for 12 to 18 year olds at Nuri High School. This involves listening to and encouraging students to talk about – mental adolescent health/ the concept of 'self' and how they fit into their world/understanding how they personally fit into their family and society. A teacher but not 'a teacher', rather a social worker with specialists on site once a fortnight - a GP and a Psychologist - to refer students to without any long, unprofitable waiting, and working within the comfortable embrace of the Education Department, Rick loves his job and loves going to work.

Throughout the years Rick has been involved in playing local sport – football for the Barossa Bulldogs and basketball, which he still plays today with a motley crew of Nuri teachers and locals! With his attitude of giving back to the community Rick has also coached young people in basketball, football and softball. I'm not sure that Lego counts as a sport, but Rick has a passion for that as well and for 17 years he has been the vocals for the band Colonel Mustard. An 'out there' and helping type of person, Rick has a great network of friends within the Williamstown and Barossa areas, an enthusiasm for learning and a deep commitment to community which has been fuelled over the years by his admiration for that wonderful community spirited Williamstown volunteer, Lyn Venning!

We wish Rick well as he continues to endorse the great values of community mindedness and spiritedness.

Temporary Relocation of Little Athletics

Little Athletics is now being held on a Friday nights at 5.30pm on the Williamstown Oval, in the Queen Victoria Jubilee Park.

It was great to see the oval marked out with the running lanes and a long jump pit established on the high side above the rock wall. A shot-put area is in place near the swimming pool, but discus and javelin areas are still works in progress.

Training sessions are on a Tuesday night from 6pm. Little Athletics is open to any youngsters aged 3 to 17 years and, if you are wondering if this is the sport for you, the first 2 sessions are 'Come and Try' and are free. There are 9 meets before Christmas and 9 after. The first one was held on Friday 18th of October.

After each meet, participants and their parents, in fact anyone from the community who wishes to come and watch the athletes perform, is invited to stay on to enjoy a time of socialising.

There are two easily accessed Defibrillators (AED's) located in Williamstown at the moment.

One is on the southern end wall of the Williamstown Hotel and the other is on the front wall of the Williamstown Caravan Park Kiosk/Office.
