#### LYNDOCH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The Historical Society's first meeting for the year was arranged for Sunday 2nd



February at 2.00 p.m. in the meeting room at the rear of the Lyndoch Library. The topic chosen for the occasion was the the history of Chapel that opened in 1850 and its versatility as it is still currently in use. It has served a

number of purposes over its 175 years. Unfortunately it was refused heritage listing as alterations had been made to the original building.

The building has been known as the following:

Chapel of The Independents	1850
Lyndoch Baptist Chapel	1859
St Jakobi Church & School	1867
St Jakobi Lutheran School	1914
St Jakobi Lutheran School (Reopened)	1935
Currently still part of the St Jakobi Education	n Complex

Recently the name Tweedy/Tweedie (can have either spelling) appeared in relation to a local development in the currently named Tweedies Gully area. In 1883 Mt Crawford Council minutes referred to putting a ford at Tweedies Gully.

In the 1860s Lyndoch had a Volunteer Rifle Company and engaged in shooting competitions with groups in other towns.

The SA Register listed the names of the rifle company volunteers in its publication. Members of the Lyndoch Rifle Company were as follows:-

#### VOLUNTEER RIFLE SHOOTING MATCHES

The Volunteer Rifle members were actively involved in practising their shooting ability should it be needed in a conflict situation. The following report indicates how dedicated they were.

The day fixed for a match between the First Gawler Rifles and the Lyndoch volunteers — it rained incessantly, a constant steady, determined rain. But, notwithstanding this, the whole of the previously arranged programme was adhered to. The volunteers had their match, although the rain was so obstructive as to render it difficult to keep the scores. The match was not completed until evening and resulted in the Lyndoch Company beating their opponents by 20 points.

Ten miles through soaking rain one company went to the rendezvous, and for five hours two companies stood in pelting rain, shivering and shaking – loading and firing – daring death (from colds) and pouring their destructive fire (upon an iron target) in all manner of position. In vain the whitening was spread upon the target, the remorseless rain came down in bucketfuls and before the first bullet reached its destination, a black patch on the side of the hill seen through the glitter of raindrops was all that could be made out, the result was as usual, the Lyndochs 22 ahead of the first Gawlers. The return of the squads to Lyndoch from the firing ground was a sight worth seeing. The creek had risen considerably and the daring adventures of the gallant warriors in crossing it were worthy of a better chronicle than the columns of a monthly paper. The gallant army on reaching the township stormed the stores for dry clothing and marched straight to the warmest quarters of the Lord Lyndoch, namely the kitchen fire.

Results of the Lyndoch Volunteer Company's rifle match against Angaston was forwarded to The SA Register in August 1861. A more favourable day for the event could not have been chosen. The target is placed on a beautiful slope below a limited range forming part of the boundary of the valley proper, about one mile and a quarter east of the township. The presence of a considerable number of youth and beauty of the valley added a grace to the scene and doubtless inspired the hearts of some of our gallant volunteers ... the Angaston Company came off victors by three points only. [Scores: Lyndoch 159, Angaston 162] ... At the conclusion of the firing the competitors assembled at the Lord Lyndoch Hotel, and with vigorous appetite and hearty good humour, demolished a substantial dinner, provided at the expense of the losers. After dinner the company enjoyed an extremely social evening, Captain Winton and Lieutenant Siems respectively occupying the chair and vice chair ... 'The Health of the Hostess' and 'The Song of Australia' by Mr Siems closed the proceedings at 8 o'clock, all present having thoroughly enjoyed themselves. The Angaston band enlivened the evening conducing much to its pleasure.

#### **Justice of the Peace Service**

# Lyndoch Library Every Saturday 10am-11.30am

This February will mark the third anniversary of the establishment of a Justice of the Peace service at the Lyndoch Library.

The service commenced in February 2022, as a result of positive community feedback, that identified a need to have a dedicated regular service, rather than have people trying to find a JP at short notice. It also means locals don't need to make the trek to Nuriootpa or Gawler on busy Saturday mornings.

Initially starting with one JP, the service grew to two, then three and towards the end of 2024 a

fourth JP joined, ensuring continuity of service, each Saturday morning at the Lyndoch Library (rear meeting room) from 10am-11.30 am. If you need a JP, urgently, at other times an internet search for "JP in SA" will point you in the right direction.

Photo: Heather Bitter, Andrew Porter and Colin Davis Since inception nearly 300 local residents have utilised the service and the JP's, with pens at the ready, have signed and dealt with almost 600 documents.

If you need documents witnessed, copies certified, identity verified, our JP's are happy to help. The service is free and no appointment is required.

The community is fortunate to have Heather Bitter JP, Colin Davies JP, Dennis Traeger JP and Andrew Porter JP volunteer their time and skills to provide this service.

The captain spoke about the care, servicing and maintenance of fire extinguishers, showing us the different types of extinguishers and explaining the types of fires each is used on. As 4WD club members we all should carry an extinguisher in our vehicles so we were informed which type of extinguisher to carry, for the best results if there was a car fire. This was followed by demonstrations on how to use them correctly with some members having a go with a water extinguisher.



Next we were shown the correct way to use a fire blanket, helpful at home or in the caravan/camper while on holidays. When using a fire blanket make sure it is held in a way that your hands are behind the blanket, and you approach the fire with the blanket hanging down in front of you so that your body is also protected.



Lastly the members had a chance to have a look over the fire appliances, and were shown the type of equipment that is carried. They are able to help in a lot of situations.


