LYNDOCH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

With 2025 being a Vintage Festival year it is nearly fifty years since Lyndoch's participation in the "Gemutlichkeit". It was in 1977 when Lyndoch finally became an integral part of the Festival with their own event on their own ground at the Lyndoch Recreation Park. It took the form of a carnival on the Easter Monday 11th April 1977.

A Lyndoch Branch Meeting was called which was well attended and those present formed the committee to organise the event. Heinz Baument is credited with coming up with the name "Gemutlichkeit" with a translation of "people gathered together enjoying themselves" as well as the difficulty with the word's pronunciation.

Being blessed with a beautiful sunny day people turned up in their thousands. Unfortunately the crowd converged on the Lyndoch Park prior to the commencement with many climbing over the fence and avoiding payment of \$1.50 Adults and 50c per child. There was a variety of food stalls and entertainment and a "Bike-a-thon" from Nuriootpa to Lyndoch was a further feature. The gate takings went to the Festival Association and the stall proceeds to the participating community groups.







Disability Parking Perhaps the most regulated piece of bitumen in Australia – in a good way.

We all know these bays are designated for vehicles displaying a permit in the windscreen. These bays and the permits are easily identified with the International Symbol of Access (ISA), which consist of a blue square overlaid in white with a stylised image of a person in a wheelchair. Find the designated space, display the permit in the windscreen and the vehicle can use the bay. Done. Well, so you would think.

Generally, they are a little wider to allow for the disabled person to have enough space to access the vehicle.

Some disabled bays have painted yellow chevron lines next to them. Seen them? What are they were about? These spaces allow room for a person with a disability to access the side of their vehicle. They are a "no parking zone" for every one – even motor cycles!!!! There is also usually a dip in the kerb near the disabled bay so that a wheelchair can get up on to the footpath.

The bays are also located close to the entry of a venue (shopping centre, school, sports stadium etc.). The benefit is people can get in and out of a car or van safely and off the road and out of harm's way in busy car parks.

Is it ever ok to have a permit displayed in a vehicle and use a disabled parking bay yet the disabled person is not present? No. It would be disappointing that someone would take advantage of the permit when they don't need the space, as it takes away access for someone else with a disability who could need it.

We should never assume though. Consider a situation where a healthy looking abled bodied, ambulant person returns alone to their car.....have they just dropped off someone who needed the space and helped them into the shops or Doctors rooms?

In South Australia, the time limit for a disabled parking bay is the time indicated on the sign, plus additional time if the permit holder has a disability parking permit.

Time limit for a disability parking permit holder

- Less than 30 minutes: Park for 30 minutes
- 30 minutes to 1 hour: Park for 2 hours
 More than 1 hour: Park for twice

the time indicated on the sign.

Permit holders can park in metered or ticket parking spaces at no charge in on-street parking areas within Adelaide city or North Adelaide. The time extensions detailed above will be granted.

Another fun fact is that thanks to Section 117 of the Australian Constitution (Protection against discrimination based on state of residency), a South Australian issued disability parking permit is valid in every other state in Australia.




