

Countdown to Festival of Footy

Food, wine, footy and community will come together in spectacular fashion next weekend when the Barossa hosts the Festival of Footy as part of 2025 AFL Gather Round.

The Barossa Council will deliver two free events for the community on the weekend of 12-13 April in a very special celebration of community pride and footy fever.

As Barossa Park at Lyndoch hosts two AFL Gather Round games and a Live Site on the second oval, the community can also get along to over 45 associated events at local wineries and venues, in what promises to be a wonderful showcase of the Barossa.

On Saturday afternoon Murray Street Tanunda will be transformed into a walkable Barossa Food & Wine Village with local restaurants, cafes and wine bars spilling into the street, a full schedule of live music headlined by South Australian act the Germein Sisters and supported by local bands and solo artists.

Crowds can also get along to the big clash between the SANFL and

VFL at Tanunda Recreation Park, as these traditional rivals go head-to-head in the AAMI State Game blockbuster.

The next day, locals can wind down with a leisurely Picnic in the Park at Tanunda Recreation Park and catch all the AFL action at Barossa Park live on the big screen.

Mayor Bim Lange says the economic impact of the Festival of Footy will be felt across the region long after the final siren.

"We couldn't have scripted a better outcome for the Barossa, with two AFL games, A Festival of Footy and tens of thousands of footy fans enjoying the best the Barossa has to offer," says Mayor Bim Lange.

Local Traffic Only access

There will be a total road closure directly in front of Barossa Park and accordingly detours will be in place. However, the roads leading into this area will remain accessible to local traffic, to ensure businesses and residents can operate

as normal including access for staff and customers.

Clear "Local Traffic Only" signage will be installed throughout the area, redirecting through traffic via alternate routes while ensuring local community and business needs are accommodated.

Road closure

On match days (April 12-13), minor extension to the total road closure area may be implemented to accommodate additional transport, including buses, and ensure public safety during peak crowd movements.

LYNDOCH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

War time activities during the WWI period always was an Australia Day event in August each year. It consisted of various groups such as Lyndoch Band, Lodge, and school children marching through the streets of Lyndoch with patriotic demonstrations at the Lyndoch Hall where there were various stalls selling their wares and usually a concert in the evening.

The Red Cross ladies also spent their time making articles of clothing after purchasing material, as well as knitted items such as socks, reaching forwarding figures such as 220 pair of socks for the year. Also sent were two dozen kit bags, four dozen handkerchiefs and sand bags also made often out of



sugar bags. The branch was also responsible for sending well packed Christmas boxes for the soldiers each year with twenty nine being sent in 1917.

A Queen Competition was organised with the Queen entrants being Transport (Mrs Gitsham – husband was Stationmaster), Children (Mrs Northey – husband was school headmaster), Sport (Mrs G.C. Randall – husband member of Lyndoch Park), Commerce (Mrs Fiebig – husband was storekeeper), and Flowers (Mrs A. Springbett). The result was gained by converting money raised into one penny votes. The Queen of Sport, Mrs Randall was crowned at an evening dance having achieved the highest total of 6895 votes. Other results were Mrs Fiebig (5842), Mrs Gitsham (5710), Mrs Northey (5220), and Mrs Springbett (1439). £104/12/2 was raised.

With the war's end the Lyndoch ladies realised the cause was no longer required and it was time for the group to disband. On 26th August 1919 a pleasant afternoon was held by the Red Cross members to formally bring the work of the Society to a close.






