Introducing the 2025 “20 Metre Trees” South Australian Tree of the Year!

Colonel Light’s Tree

Located on Barossa Valley Way, near Keis Family Wines, the tree is 7m in diameter and is thought to be in the region of 700 years old.


The tree features in sketchings of Colonel William Light, originally in December 1837 when he surveyed the area. Whilst camped here, Colonel Light was reminded of the geography of the location of the Battle of Barrosa in Spain, where he took part in the Peninsular War of 1811.

The Colonel Light Tree is currently not protected by heritage listing. The push to have the tree recognised on state heritage lists has garnered renewed enthusiasm since the nomination and award-

ing of the South Australian Tree of the Year.

The Lyndoch Historical Society (in particular Ann Hausler), Reuben Batten) and Kim Michelmore were instrumental in raising awareness of the need for protection and recognition of our beloved tree.

Serendipitously, Reuben Batten joined Kies Family Wines and when shown Colonel William Light’s sketch to the hill line in a photograph of the Keis cellar door from 1984, it is unquestionably the same location. With that new evidence, movement is afoot to reapply for heritage listing of the 2025 South Australian Tree of the Year.

Tour Town Under returns to Tanunda

For the third year running, Tanunda will “feel the rush” of the Santos Tour Down Under (TDU), with the town again hosting a start and finish on 21 January, 2026.

Stage 1 of the Santos Tour Down Under Men’s Race will see riders tackle 120.6 kilometres through the region, offering plenty of vantage points for spectators to enjoy the action along the way, includ-

ing a Ziptrak® Sprint past Lyndoch’s famed Barossa Park.

“The Barossa has been an integral part of the Santos Tour Down Under since its inception, so we are naturally delighted to be going back there again in January,” Race Director Stuart O’Grady said.

“The race goes out past Lyndoch and the Barossa Park which is a great addition to the state and used for Gather Round this year. Then riders come back through Tanunda for the more traditional circuit through Angaston and the back of Mengler’s Hill where they’ll do three laps before the finish.”

LYNDOCH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The next meeting of the Lyndoch Historical Society will be held on Sunday 3rd August at 2.00 p.m. in the Meeting Room at the rear of the Lyndoch Library. Continuing the World War theme the topic will revert back 80 years to 1945 when WWII ended and how the community responded.

Looking at tree planting in Lyndoch over the years, it seems Arbor Days were celebrated annually by schools with this occurring in Lyndoch. This meant that it fell mainly to the juvenile residents to do the tree planting to beautify their town. A newspaper article suggests the first Arbor Day was held in July 1906.

Arbor Day was celebrated at Lyndoch for the first time when *sixty pine trees were planted around the oval on the Lyndoch Recreation Ground by the children attending the State school. The scholars were instructed by the head teacher concerning the planting of the trees during the morning at school. Planting commenced at 2.p.m. when holes were dug by volunteers and the committee. Stakes and wire-netting guards were erected. A few of the public attended, but most of the work fell on the ground committee. The children were provided with refreshments by the committee and their teacher. Mr Klauber, a member of the committee, has promised to plough a ring for a bicycle track, inside the pine row, and in a few years the ground should be a very pretty one.* [The Bunyip 20.7.1906]

The following year on Friday afternoon 2nd August, Arbor Day was celebrated by the children of the public school. *After assembling at the school the children were marched by the head teacher (Mr M.H. Thiele) to the Recreation Park where a large number of pines were planted. The park committee rendered valuable assistance by preparing the ground and erecting guards around the young trees. At the conclusion of the planting the children were regaled with oranges, presented by Mr F.K. Warren.* [The Bunyip 7.8.1907]

For Arbor Day 1910 a few trees were planted in the cemetery and Recreation Park and eighteen Remarkable pines around the new Institute grounds, a half acre block – absolutely the most valuable in town – offered by the South Australian Company. [The Bunyip 29.7.1910]

Q. What's your favourite type of cuisine?

A. *A well done steak, Caesar salad, crispy bacon, scrambled eggs.*

Q. What's your favourite season?

A. *Summer for the sun, beaches and long nights. Winter for hot drinks, warm food and cuddles with loved ones.*

Q. What's your favourite way to stay active?

A. *Keeping my hands busy and my mind active, playing games, playing musical instruments, singing and cycling. Learning every day!*

Q. What's a skill you're proud of?

A. *Creating the Let's Chat Barossa podcast with Barossa Community Radio (BBB FM). I love talking and listening to people – using the skills I've built over the years to promote the Barossa to local, national and international listeners*

Q. Do you enjoy spending time outdoors?

A. *Yes, I love spending time with my kids outside. I work outdoors with my small business, Howzat Gardening and Handyman Services.*

Q. What's your favourite movie or TV show?

A. *TV show : Ted Lasso. Just watched it and loved it! Favourite movie: Love Actually ... yes, I'm a romantic and proud of it!*



It's referred to in the media as The InterContinental Barossa Resort & Spa.

- It's HUGE! Nearly 14,000m², 20m high and 235m long (Adelaide Oval is 167m long)
- Within 15km of Barossa Park, Lyndoch, there are already three specifically zoned areas deemed suitable for large-scale luxury tourist accommodation projects.
 - Château Tanunda
 - Novotel Barossa Valley Resort, Rowland Flat. 140 rooms. 120 hectares more land.
 - Seppeltsfield (Oscar), 71 rooms.
- Nexus Barossa (Yaldara Drive, Lyndoch) is an approved 124 room development.
