With glasses of champagne, the arrival of a Workman's toilet was toasted! On Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> of August Building Consent was finally passed, and the arrival of the building contractors occurred during following week. Everyone was so excited and three passing trucks acknowledged our presence with cheerful blasts from their horns. Everyone in the group, as well as people passing by, had something to say about the beginning of the actual supermarket at long last! ### 'Make-Overs' in Williamstown

Williamstown seems to be in the grip of a 'Make-Over' flurry!

Recently the Williamstown Medical Clinic was closed for a few weeks whilst major changes to the interior of the building took place. Extending into an area not needed by the police station, which itself has been undergoing interior changes, the clinic now boasts a more compact waiting room, a new consulting room for the visiting Clinpath Nurse and two more consulting rooms for part-time and visiting doctors, taking the total of doctors' rooms up to five. Not only will these changes provide better facilities but doctor's who were having to make their phone consults from home, due to lack of space at the Clinic, will no longer have to. The Clinic hopes to improve services by now having 3 doctors and a nurse on duty most days. The décor looks pretty smart too, with fresh white paint and new, dark grey, carpet tiles. L.L.




### **Graham and Toto**

Graham Todd was born in Salisbury in the old hospital which is now a KFC! He was raised in Blair Athol and served an apprenticeship as a wood machinist preparing timbers for carpenters. Moving into Sales and Management in the Food Industry Graham spent 3 years in Tasmania managing Rosella Foods before returning to Adelaide and becoming, at one time, the Manager of Yates and Hortico. Later, he ran his own business for 20 years before retiring and has lived in Williamstown for the last 13 years. Graham has always had dogs in his life and after his last dog died, nearly 2 years ago, Graham decided to pursue a long-held desire to help train a Guide Dog. After contacting Guide Dogs SA/NT, Graham's property, already set up to accommodate dogs safely, was deemed suitable and he became a 'Puppy Raiser'. His 7-week-old golden labrador puppy arrived in Adelaide, coming from Sydney with his 2 brothers. The puppies were already named by the Guide Dog Association in line with their 'alphabetical' policy, so Toto came from a litter of "T's" - Toto, Tofu and Tacho! Graham was given a manual on how to train Toto to become a Guide Dog, starting with the basic commands of Sit, Stand and Down, in addition to a command for 'ablutions on demand'! Support was available from the Guide Dogs Association in the form of a lady called Sheradin, who, to begin with, came out once every fortnight, then once every month, then once every six weeks. As time progressed, the commands became more in depth, for example, Toto might be called to come to Graham from a long distance away. This would occur when other dogs and people were around, so Toto would have to concentrate on what his master was requiring him to do and not be distracted by all the other interesting and exciting things going on around him. When he was fed, Toto had to learn to wait for Graham to whistle three times before he could eat. Coming in and out of doors Toto needed to wait for the command, as with going up and down stairs, which is a really lovely moment for observers, as the dog puts his front paws on the bottom step – and waits! Toto, when in training, proudly wears his Guide Dog in Training Jacket, which is a warning also to people not to pat him and distract him from his tasks. When not wearing his jacket Toto knows he can behave like a 'normal' dog and not one destined for a great career in service to someone with a disability. Toto is a very strong dog, so, when out and about, he is attached to Graham by a "gentle leader", a lead which stops him from pulling, but puts no pressure on his neck and only gentle pressure on his nose as he walks alongside Graham. Every time Toto obeys a command he is rewarded with a treat, which is Kibble, the only food he and all other Guide Dogs eat. Toto loves going to Rundle Mall and saying "Hello!" to the Pigs!! He also goes to the football – and is an avid Port Power Supporter!! An experienced Public Transport rider, on the train Graham sits sideways, and Toto sits between his legs and doesn't move! For their last outing together - it will be a train ride to the city! At night, Toto lays in front of the fire and only moves to go out before bed! Two times a week Toto, wearing his Training Jacket, accompanies Graham to the Men's Shed in Williamstown where he is a firm favourite! Recently, Toto went through a two-week Evaluation and the Head Trainers agreed that he has the potential to be a Guide Dog, which didn't mean much to Toto but meant a great deal to Graham who has worked very hard in the training of Toto. Now Toto must leave Graham and their life together as he has 5 months of intense training before graduating as a Guide Dog. However, there are no guarantees that he will become one, as only one third of all dogs going through the programme become a Guide Dog. Of the other two thirds many are 'reclassified'. Some work as Companion Dogs or Facility Dogs or have a career change, stop working and become pets. Graham will receive a report on Toto's progress in this new chapter of his life at 12 weeks, then at 16 weeks, and finally at 20 weeks, which will be the end of Toto's training programme. Guide Dogs SA/NT do not receive any Government Support and rely totally on public donations for their very necessary charitable work.

### **Graham and Toto (cont)**

As well as donating people can also become part time puppy carers, stepping in when a full-time carer becomes temporarily unavailable. Graham was well aware of what he was signing up for in the training of Toto, but his departure will still be a huge wrench, to say nothing of how bewildering it will be for Toto! Both man and dog are to be commended for their selfless dedication. Toto will go on to brighten many lives along his way and the good news for Graham, the man with the caring, generous heart, is – he welcomes a new puppy into his life in January! Congratulations on a job well done, Graham! (With Many Thanks to Graham for sharing his and Toto's story with us. 




