



The final event for the year is the celebration of Lyndoch Naming Day that will be held at 6.00 p.m. on Saturday 13th December at the Cairn in the town square.

It commemorates the occasion when Colonel Light named Lynedoch Vale on that day in 1837 establishing the "Birthplace of the Barossa".

The topic for the occasion will mark the 185th Anniversary of the settlement of Lyndoch in September 1840.

Spring Declutter and Save

The Barossa Council is again offering a kerbside collection service or waste voucher to eligible residents, as part of its popular "Declutter and Save" initiative.

Both incentives require people to register directly with Solo Resource Recovery by phoning 8159 5053 or emailing adelaide.ops@solo.com.au, to schedule either a kerbside collection date (between 20 October and 13 November) or secure a voucher to

Council's hard waste kerbside collection option enables people to dispose of up to two cubic metres of household hard waste material at their kerbside.

be redeemed by 14 December.

The service will be available to the first 500 residents from Angaston, Eden Valley, Lyndoch, Moculta, Mount Pleasant, Nuriootpa, Penrice, Sandy Creek, Springton, Stockwell, Tanunda and Williamstown.

Accepted materials include furniture (excluding mattresses), white goods including fridges and freez-

ers, electronics such as TVs and computers, carpets, gardening equipment, metal and timber.

Meanwhile, rural and township residents who don't secure a kerbside collection are eligible for a hard waste and/or green waste voucher valued at \$75.

Five hundred vouchers will be available on a first-in-first-served basis to be redeemed at Springton Transfer Station, Eco Waste Solutions, the Yard Clean Up Man and KAND do it.

Vouchers are available for domestic waste only, with a range of waste materials accepted depending on the vendor. Vouchers must be used by 14 December and, to make it a little easier, the Springton Transfer Station will be open extra days, including 25 October and 22 November.

"Just note, only one service is available per financial year," Mayor Lange said. "So, if you choose to claim a voucher or book a kerbside collection during this 'Declutter and Save' promotion you are ineligible to participate in the next one. But stay tuned, there are plans for the initiative to return next financial year."

RELEASE OF AN ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT FOR PUBLIC COMMENT



The Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Southern Barossa Winery and Tourist Accommodation Project, by Strategic Alliance and Commercial Pty Ltd, is being released by the Minister for Planning for public comment from Wednesday 5 November 2025 until Wednesday 17 December 2025.

The proposal can generally be described as development involving a change in land use and building work associated with the construction and operation of tourist accommodation (in the form of a multi-level hotel building, with restaurant, function-conference facilities, wellness-spa, pool and other recreational facilities, outdoor areas and associated carparking) and a winery, cellar door, indoor and outdoor function areas, and carparking; and ancillary service infrastructure and civil works.


