

# 2025 Lyndoch Street Party - Bigger, Brighter and LOUDER Friday 12 December · 5:30pm-10:00pm · On the Street

What began as a simple idea to "bring it back to the street" has grown into one of the biggest community nights on the Southern Barossa calendar. This year the Street Party steps up again, with bigger stages, more kids' activities, and a louder, upgraded sound system, plus even more local clubs and businesses joining in the fun.

When we call it a community event, we mean it. The credit rightly belongs to the community. A night like this relies on local businesses stepping up, in-kind support, sports clubs, schools, preschools and many generous volunteers. It may be guided by a small committee, but a Street Party of this scale is only possible when it's embraced as a community event.

This year's Lyndoch Street Party is again a free, fully licensed, family-friendly event, running from 5:30pm to 10:00pm on Friday 12 December.



### A Big Night Out... With a Big Price Tag

Behind the scenes, the Street Party is a substantial undertaking. This year's event is budgeted at around \$20,000, with insurance making up the largest single cost.

Making the entire event licensed also adds significantly to expenses, but allows adults to freely roam

within the event area with drinks purchased from participating vendors. Local business sponsorship and in-kind support are critical to keeping the event free for the community.

Two Stages, Bigger Sounds



One of the major upgrades this year is the expanded stage and sound setup.

Local stage company Nexstage has enabled the event to run two professional stages – a main band stage and a dedicated kids' stage. Lyndoch's own sound specialists Active AV are providing larger speakers for the band and a street-spanning PA system, ensuring music and announcements can be clearly heard along the length of the street.

Two local bands, Colonel
Mustard and The Brown Dogs, will
perform on the main stage
throughout the evening. The kids'
stage will host "Sing Along with
Jimmy" (Jimmy Sings), Christmas
carols from St Jakobi and Lyndoch
Primary, along with a performance
from La Dance Circle, creating a
lively, family-friendly program.

#### Mega Meat Raffle Funding Future Events

The Mega Meat Raffle will be drawn on the night, with a total prize pool of \$2,700.

The major prize is ½ a steer, with the option to choose a \$1,000 voucher at The Lyndoch Butcher instead for those with smaller freezers.

All proceeds from the raffle will be directed towards funding future Street Parties, helping manage rising costs and keep the event free to attend.

#### Eat, Drink & Support Local

A key focus of the Street Party is ensuring that **community groups** share in the benefits of the event.

A bar will be run by Lyndoch Cricket Club and Barossa District Football & Netball Club (BDFNC), with support from the Lyndoch Hotel.

The BBQ will be run by the Lyndoch Tennis Club and Southern Barossa Scouts, supported by Lagana's IGA and The Lyndoch Butcher.

Proceeds from these areas go back to the clubs providing volunteers.

Families can follow the expanded **Candy Cane Trail**, which links together a series of fun activities run by local clubs:

- Netball shooting Barossa District Netball
- Mini sprint track Lyndoch & District Little Athletics Club (LADLAC)
- Giant inflatable hitting wall Lyndoch Tennis Club

The Candy Cane Trail is sponsored by **Barossa Fun Factory**, which will run an **Elf Obstacle Course**. Children who complete the course become a "**qualified Elf**".

At the end of the trail, children can meet the Street Party Elf, "Mel", who will hand out prizes sponsored by **Shorter Legal** and **Ashton Hurn MP**.

The kids' zone will also include jumping castles and a petting zoo, plus a face painting by Ray White Barossa Valley / Two Wells.

#### Colouring, Race Cars, Scenic Flights & More

This year, **Ashton Hurn MP** joins the event as a **Platinum partner**. As part of this support, **a colouring competition** has been rolled out across Lyndoch Primary, Lyndoch Preschool, Williamstown Primary, Sandy Creek Primary and St Jakobi, with **winners** to be drawn on the night of the Street Party.

There will be plenty of attractions for older children and adults as well:

- A V8 Supercar display, brought to the event by Racetorque Media
- An inflatable dome golf simulator, thanks to a partnership between Lyndoch Hotel and Lyndoch Post Office
- Lyndoch Motors showcasing giant farm machinery
- CFS trucks and volunteers on site to talk about firefighting and community safety
- Barossa Helicopters conducting scenic flights in conjunction with the event



The main street will also host a range of **artisan and market stalls**, including embroidery, jewellery, homewares, trinkets, hair braiding and motorcycle-related products.

Many main street businesses will open late, offering Christmas gift ideas and special deals.

So round up the family, invite a few friends, and come and experience Lyndoch at its best – streets closed, lights on, music up and the whole community out together for one big night. Fri 12 December 5:30-!0pm

Located under the tree near the town's Village Green pergola on Barossa Valley Way, the bin is part of a twelve-month trial by The Barossa Council encouraging recycling while contributing to a more sustainable region.

It also represents a new partnership with the Lyndoch Community Committee whose members are taking it in turns emptying the bin each week to collect the proceeds.

Steve Balch, Chair of the Lyndoch Community Committee, said all money raised will support local

events and help create a more vibrant town.

"One of the things we did recently, for example, was put the Lyndoch Mural on the wall here. We are trying to raise the profile of the town, particularly now that we have things like Gather Round coming," Steve said.

"So, as a committee, we are very excited to have this. We've had recycling baskets, but they are open to people coming in

and helping themselves."

When Council asked whether the committee would be interested in participating in the trial, Steve said there was no hesitation in saying yes.

"This is a great initiative and a great one to involve the community," he added.



After sell-out games and a successful 2025 appearance, Barossa has again secured two AFL games at Barossa Park, Lyndoch as part of 2026 AFL Gather Round... A Festival of Footy.

Our picturesque, Barossa Park will play host to two big games with North Melbourne going head-to-head with Brisbane on Saturday, 11 April at 12.05pm; and GWS facing Richmond on Sunday, 12 April at 2.45pm.

Mayor Bim Lange said it's fantastic for the Barossa to be featured in the 2026 fixture, acknowledging the economic benefit the event brings to the region.

"Last year was a huge success, and iconic, as we celebrated the opening of Barossa Park. We're excited to build on this next year and deliver an even bigger and better experience for footy fans and visitors," he said.

"We're well advanced in our planning of events, like the Barossa Food and Wine Village, which will be a great showcase of our incredible food and wine and a great way to wind down after the game.

"As a region, we can't wait to welcome interstate visitors and encourage them to spend time exploring the best of the Barossa,

outside of the football."

Gather Round tickets will go on sale via Ticketek on Wednesday, 3 December for club and AFL members, and Thursday, 4 December for the general public.

### State award for Barossa Park

Barossa Park has been named South Australian Community Football Facility of the Year (over \$3.5million), further cementing its role as the region's premier destination for recreation and sport.

Presented at the SANFL Community Volunteers Awards Night held at Adelaide Oval on Friday, the award recognised the venue's outstanding contributions to community football infrastructure and the positive impact it has had on the game and local community.

Mayor Bim Lange said The Barossa Council was proud to have created such an incredible community facility through collaboration and investment from the State Government and the community.

"This award is testament to our forward-thinking Council and highlights a shared vision to not only build a landmark multi-use precinct where sport and community come together, but to create a venue that attracts events and brings people to the Barossa," Mayor Lange said.

"Barossa Park has already proven to be a huge asset for local sporting clubs, including the Barossa District Football and Netball Club completing their first season in their new home, and the cricket, little athletics, tennis, bowls, and pigeon clubs are now actively using the facility."

#### HAPPY 10th BIRTHDAY SOUTHERN BAROSSA MEN'S SHED!

On December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2014, well-known local identity Glen Venning called a meeting to consider if there was enough interest for establishing a Men's Shed in Williamstown. The meeting was held in the small front lounge of Wirraminna (or Abbeyfield as it was then).

As the interest was there, a more formal meeting was held in the January of 2015, again at Wirraminna, with an attendance of 9 interested persons who decided to pursue the project. Assisted throughout its 10 years by Wirraminna, the Men's Shed began in a little 20 by 20-foot garage in the grounds of Wirraminna.

November the 14<sup>th</sup> 2020, saw the move to their bespoke 40 by 30-foot New Shed behind the Little Shop of Treasures, with whom they have a similar close relationship as they do with Wirraminna. Local lad Alex Gill donated his labour in the levelling of the ground for this shed, while local electrician, Peter Keelan, sorted out all the electrical work for free also.

When the keys were handed over in May, the Men's Shed Members all busied themselves with the interior work, creating closed off Meeting Room and toilet areas, and installing their donated equipment. Along the way they have been helped with Grants from the Barossa Council and The Australian Men's Shed Association. In 2024 a second shed, 20 by 20 -foot was donated by Klose's Foodland as they cleared the site for the soon to be Supermarket! This shed was quickly deconstructed and marched across the road by Shed Members to be rebuilt on their site as a metal workshop!

I quote from a Men's Shed article -"Coffee Time is the best time! Sometimes with all the banter you need your rubber boots to get through all the you know what!" The Men's Shed's great strength lies in its ability to make all members feel welcome. There is a sincere spirit of camaraderie and a sense of personal worth amongst the men. You do not have to come to The Shed with anything but yourself, nor do you need to do anything - just have a coffee and a natter! Once there, you can undertake your own projects if you wish or you'll find heaps of interesting activities going on and, if you choose to do so, you can develop skills in many practical areas in a supportive and helpful environment. Lots of 'sharing' goes on!

On Tuesday and Wednesday mornings, the members can be found doing tasks for the School, the History Society, Wirraminna, the Op. Shop, Barossa Wildlife ('nesting boxes') and for many locals as well as themselves.

They are the BBO experts and fundraise for various organizations as well as for themselves, including, in September this year, raising \$526 towards Tony Pasin's Prostrate Cancer Awareness Fund. When asked of their hopes and plans for the future, three projects surfaced - renovating the old jail next to their Shed, pursuing, in conjunction with our Historical Society, the possibility of creating a forge for Blacksmithing and thirdly, extending the use of their Metal Shed. However, the main plan is to simply keep on enjoying each other's company and welcoming new members.

I doubt they will have any trouble doing this! Happy Birthday Men's Shed Members!! L.L.



# LYNDOCH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The next meeting of the Lyndoch Historical Society will take place at 6.00 p.m. on Saturday 13th December in the meeting room at the rear of the Lyndoch Library.

The occasion will mark the 185th Anniversary of the settlement of Lyndoch in September 1840 being the first town in the Barossa.

The DVD recording of the 175th celebrations held at the Institute in September 2015 will be shown.



#### LYNDOCH NAMING DAY 1989

In 1989 the Historical Society approached Council to assist in obtaining heritage status for Hoffnungsthal as it was unique area. At the time writing family histories was becoming a new genre and the Society was receiving numerous inquiries regarding relatives who settled at Hoffnungsthal. As there was no signage to indicate where the village was it was decided to erect a memorial with the names of Hoffnungsthal settlers who died there. The resulting sign was placed on the public road verge as the settlement site was on private property.

Thirty six years ago about 100 people were present at the third Lyndoch Naming Day held on Wednesday 13th December 1989. It commenced at the Council Office in Lyndoch where District Clerk, John Stephens gave a short address in which he referred to the problem of keeping a balance in the Lyndoch district as it is affected by change.

Those present then assembled at the site of the former Hoffnungsthal settlement. Rev Paech, Lutheran Church President in SA, recalled in an address the hardships of the pioneer settlers. A memorial interpretive board containing the names of people now buried in unmarked graves on the site was organised by the Lyndoch Historical Society with the assistance of the District Council of Barossa. This was unveiled by Mesdames Melva Semmler and Anne Hausler. Rev Schiller launched a short history of the Lutheran Church in Lyndoch that had been written by Pastor H. Proeve.

The event concluded with a community tea held at the Barossa Settlers Winery where the hospitality of Howard and Joan Haese was enjoyed.






