



The Third Forefather of Williamstown – George Warren

Why George Warren? After all he never lived in Williamstown.

The Warren name is synonymous with the Mt Crawford area, but what about George?

He was born in Coxton, Morayshire Scotland in 1820 to John and Lydia Warren. He was apprenticed as a surveyor on the first and principal railroads in Scotland. Later he was engaged to survey the estates of the Duke of Richmond.

In 1842 his parents immigrated to South Australia where his father John started the first brewery on the banks of the Torrens River, in Adelaide, then sold the business and bought the land we know today as Springfield. Much of that land is now under the Warren Reservoir.

In 1842 George and his brother John set sail in the Iona for Melbourne and then continued to South Australia. They joined their parents for some time at Springfield and then George accepted an engagement to survey much of the land belonging to George Fife Angus.

By 1850 he moved to Gawler and set up business as a surveyor and auctioneer. He conducted sales regularly at the Old Bushman Yards, and he was also involved in numerous enterprises as was expected of a gentleman of education and business ability.

He, like Thomas Adams and Lewis Johnston was only a young man (22) when he arrived in South Australia with the future before him. He married in 1855 to Lucy Cave and they had a small tribe of children. They resided in Gawler, where George became very involved in Societies and Corporations within the town. In 1861 he was co-auditor with Mr. Burton to the Gawler Town and Suburban Building and Investment Society and a member of the Gawler Agricultural and Horticultural Society.

What of his association with Williamstown? His name appeared frequently in Mt Crawford minutes as he was involved in the development of new roads into and around the town. The government of the time was trying to develop roads to increase and facilitate better connections and speed up transport of goods from the Eastern States. The first roads in the area were little more than bullock tracks that became impassable in winter. New road layouts were needed as well as bridges. George must have had a flare for building bridges as he was given the job of designing the first bridge over Victoria Creek at the end of Queen Street.

In 1857 Lewis Johnston had the area of land around Victoria Creek Hotel surveyed and subdivided into town allotments. He was keen to have a bridge to bring business into his proposed new town of "Williams Town", so he co-operated with the council to reline the tracks across his land on Section 984 (Mt Crawford Road) to connect with the new proposed bridge.

Getting precise dating on the bridge is difficult as the Council was looking at building several other bridges at this time and was not always specific in their recording. I believe George Warren's first bridge was washed away before completion or soon after in 1859c and he redesigned a sturdier bridge which was completed around 1862.

Unfortunately, this one was also washed away in the flood of August 1862. From a correspondent to the SA Register, August 23, 1862. "I regret to add that the new bridge over Victoria Creek has been entirely destroyed, and all the footbridges on the river and creek swept away".

By 1867 the next bridge proved more resilient, but prior to this, Lewis Johnston had requested George Warren to auction all his property. In the Adelaide Observer January 23, 1858 "George Warren is instructed to sell" "The Township of Williamston, Section No. 984." (note different spelling) On October 9, 1858, an Advertisement in The South Australian Weekly Chronicle announced an "important sale of landed property in and near Gawler, to take place at the Willaston Hotel on October 18."

Obviously, there were no takers. On June 1, 1860, George Warren was granted the title of Section 35, 984 and part 985. George Warren now owned Williamstown, certainly the area subdivided and designated as town allotments, (except the hotel and grounds, allotment 52 owned by George Snellgrove). I believe his gesture was fundamental to the survival of the fledgling town. By making it financially easier to acquire a piece of land, he was establishing the Lewis Johnston plan. The terms for purchase, was payment within three years. Many of the locals took advantage of this to set up their small businesses. The land title was guaranteed after the final payment.

George Warren would have funded the development from his own purse, £250, and I believe he saved the town from sliding into obscurity. Had the land been acquired as a farm, Johnston's subdivision would have remained undeveloped.

On August 25, 1895, George Warren died as a result of injuries sustained in a level crossing accident near Roseworthy. He was 74 years of age and greatly missed by family, friends and the wider community.

Reservoirs partnership program boosts recreation across SA

Five South Australian community organisations have received a combined total of \$43,700 through SA Water's 2025-26 Reservoirs Partnership Program, supporting innovative programs and events designed to help people enjoy, explore and preserve the state's reservoir reserves.

Through the program, not-for-profit organisations can apply for up to \$10,000 to support grassroots initiatives that promote conservation, education and recreation, while strengthening community connection with these unique spaces.

SA Water's Manager of Environment and Recreation Dr Brooke Swaffer said reservoir reserves offer great opportunities for recreation, learning and community connection.

"The Reservoirs Partnership Program creates more chances for South Australians to connect with nature, stay active and explore the environments that make our state special," Brooke said.

"This year's program supports a diverse range of activities ranging from paddling and cycling to citizen science and adventure racing. We're excited to see how these initiatives will inspire families and individuals to enjoy the great outdoors in safe and sustainable ways."

CEO of Bike SA Sue Bowman said her organisation is thrilled to be one of the new program partners.

"This funding will help us deliver a community cycling event at Happy Valley Reservoir Reserve, offering rides for both beginners and experienced cyclists. Reservoirs provide a unique space for people to get active, connect with nature, and explore South Australia's trails in a safe and inclusive way."

Events and activities hosted by this year's recipients will take place on various dates throughout the year. Activities open to the community will be promoted by the hosting organisation and shared through Reservoirs South Australia's social media channels.

2025-26 recipients include:

- **Paddle SA - Paddle Power** – A program designed to get individuals and family groups paddling safely at Happy Valley Reservoir Reserve.
- **Bike South Australia Inc - Discovery Ride** – Supporting families, beginner riders, schools, clubs and recreational cyclists through guided rides at Happy Valley Reservoir Reserve,
- **Adelaide Canoe Club** – A community day that includes a community BBQ, come-and-try paddling sessions, interactive educational stations and conservation workshops at Myponga Reservoir Reserve.
- **Murraylands Multisports** – A Total Recon Adventure Race series combining running, mountain biking, and kayaking with navigation across Happy Valley and Myponga reservoir reserves.
- **TAFE SA - Junior Bio Blitz/Citizen Science Day** – A day for families with children aged 4 to 8 years to explore nature at South Para Reservoir Reserve. Activities include birdwatching, bird sound recording, and two nature-based workshops where children can learn more about macroinvertebrates, planting, ecosystem walks, bee hotels, nest boxes, seed bombs and nature-inspired drawing.





Tony Pasin MP - Op-Ed - January 2026

Addressing the Legislative Response to the Bondi Beach Terror Attack

There has been a great deal of focus on Labor's Omnibus Hate Laws and the decisions taken by the Parliament in recent days. Given the scale and significance of this legislation, it is important to set out clearly what was proposed by Labor, what was changed and where I stand.

The Liberal Party forced the Prime Minister to split Labor's original Bill. That mattered. Labor attempted to push through a sprawling package that bundled firearms changes alongside so-called "hate laws", including provisions that posed a real threat to freedom of speech. The Liberal Party drew a clear line and Labor was forced to abandon the speech-restricting measures that should never have been proposed.

On firearms, my position is clear. I voted against Labor's new gun laws. These laws punish responsible, lawful firearms owners while doing nothing to protect Australians from terrorism or violent extremism. With the support of the Greens, Labor had the numbers to force these laws through despite strong opposition.

On the other matters debated, my focus was equally clear: target extremists, hate preachers, and terrorist groups. With respect to these target groups I agree with measures that strengthen Australia's ability to deal with genuine threats from extremist groups, including neo-Nazis and Hizb-ut-Tahrir.

Specifically, the Liberal Party strengthened the powers of the Immigration Minister to cancel visas and deport non-citizens on character grounds.

We agreed to toughened existing racial vilification offences, creating aggravated penalties - up to 15 years' imprisonment - for hate preachers who incite violence in the name of their religion.

We also made laws to prescribe groups such as Hizb-ut Tahrir, the Neo-Nazi National Socialist Network or other hate groups who incite violence or target people based on their racial or ethnicity.

These changes go after the real problem: violent extremism. They do not silence debate, criminalise opinion, or erode free speech.

So let me be clear. I did not vote for Labor's gun laws. I did not vote for hate speech laws. I did however vote to strengthen Australia's ability to ban terror organisations, cancel visas, deport extremists and impose tougher penalties on those who incite violence.

Australians deserve laws that protect them from terrorists, not laws that punish the innocent or restrict free speech.

New project set to inspire youth creativity



A new Council project is set to inspire youth creative expression and reduce vandalism and graffiti in Williamstown.

The Barossa Council has engaged with local youth and developed a co-design project that will redivert graffiti and foster creativity, connection and positive social engagement.

A practice public art wall will be installed, followed by a series of hands-on workshops, with a professional artist, to hone youth's creative skills, before they turn their new talents to creating an art wall on the toilet block at Victoria Creek.

Mayor Bim Lange said youth are an important part of the community and this co-design project goes a long way to addressing some of the concerns of local youth.

"We've listened to the youth; with their concerns and ideas and we're confident this project will inspire creative expression," he said.

Council is seeking community feedback on the Council site identified to install a practice public art wall.

"We're committed to actively engaging with the Williamstown community. As part of the project, we've identified a location for the practice wall – (Colonist Corner Reserve) near the bike track at the back of the Williamstown Hotel. It's a community space with great accessibility for young people," he said.

"We're keen to hear from the Williamstown community about the proposed location. Through our survey, we're encouraging the community to express ideas not just on this pilot initiative, but other concerns facing local youth."

Mayor Lange said Council officers have already started engaging with neighbouring properties and businesses, updating and highlighting them on this project which will provide an outlet for youth to express their creativity.

Whilst acknowledging the Victoria Creek toilet block as the target of ongoing graffiti, this new approach of empowering youth through skill development and ownership of a space, will reduce graffiti.

"It's proven when young people have confidence and a place to express themselves, it strengthens community connection and helps tackle the root causes of illegal graffiti."
