George Snellgrove – Licensee and later owner of Victoria Hotel/Williamstown Hotel

George was born in Southampton, Hampshire UK in 1824 to parents Mary Eyles and Richard Snellgrove. In 1845 he married Mary Ann Richards in Southampton. Their first two daughters, Louise in 1847 and Martha 1848 were born in Southampton. In 1853 they embarked on the ship the Standard with George's brother Charles bound for South Australia. Ellen Standard Snellgrove was born onboard in 1853, and the first son was born in Adelaide in 1855 followed by Edward 1857, Victoria Hotel and George, 1859 at Williamstown. So much of their early history is recorded in the birth of their children.

Early records suggested that George was a shoemaker, but he was also recorded as a sawyer and publican. However, something must have attracted him to Victoria Creek. Perhaps it was the early timber industry, but it wasn't long before he found himself as publican of the Victoria Hotel under the ownership of Thomas Adams. In September 1856 he applied for a certificate authorizing the transfer of the license to him from Thomas Adams, which was granted.

In 1857 Thomas Adams had a seven-year lease drawn up for George Snellgrove. In the lease there was a stipulation that within the first three years an extension consisting of 3 bedrooms and one double bedroom be added to the original building and finished in the same style, Thomas Adams pays half of the cost.

After Thomas Adams sold his ownership of the Hotel and land in Victoria Creek to Lewis Johnston, George continued to hold the lease and license and the building program took place. In 1859 when Lewis Johnston sold all his property it appears that George Snellgrove bought the Hotel, although we don't have a title to date, but we know from George Warren's title of 1859 that George Snellgrove owned Lot 52 with the Hotel and out-buildings. In 1873 he had a lease drawn up for John Bain to take over running the Hotel, now named Williamstown Hotel. John Bain was husband of Louise Snellgrove and son-in-law of George Snellgrove.

George Snellgrove may not have been the colourful character that Thomas Adams and Lewis Johnston, had been but he was there to stay, and he owner the Williamstown Hotel until his death in 1896. From newspaper accounts both he and his wife were very community minded.

He appeared to be renowned as a host. In 1863 he provided an annual dinner for "Court Williamstown", we are more familiar with the name "Foresters". The SA Weekly Chronicle August 15, 1863, writes that "Upwards of 30 brethren and friends sat down to an excellent dinner provided by Host Snellgrove".

At this time the small community of Williamstown did not have a building suitable for public functions. The fledgling Mt Crawford Council used the hotel as its meeting place prior to owning its own Council Hall. Meetings of civic importance were held there, such as the appointment of a Headmaster of the Williamstown School.

In November 1868 George's wife Mary died after a recent illness. By an account in the SA Register Thursday 12, November, she was greatly respected for her kindness and generosity. "There were between 200 and 300 people assembled, testament to their respect to the departed by following the coffin to its last resting place".

However, George continued doing what he did best, running his hotel and hosting events. On New Years Eve 1869 he was hosting his annual dinner with entertainment. In 1880 he was hosting the Foresters again with the front of the hotel "tastefully draped with pine trees and branches".

On February 9, 1896, George Snellgrove died. He still owned the hotel and lived there, although he no longer ran the hotel nor held the license. The license had passed through numerous hands including his son- in-law John Bain and his daughter Martha Thomas as well as the Taylor family. He had been a resident of the district for about 40 years and was a mine of information about the area and enjoyed telling stories of the early days (don't we wish we could hear them). He is buried in the Williamstown Cemetery with his wife Mary Ann.

Please sign my Petition to Keep Labor's Hands Off Our Guns

In the wake of the horrific Bondi Beach terror attack, Australians quite rightly expected governments to act. That expectation must be met with seriousness, responsibility and evidence-based decision making. It must also be met without resorting to symbolism that targets the wrong people.

Recently, I voted against firearms legislation introduced by the Federal Labor Government in response to the Bondi attack because guns didn't cause this atrocity the failure to confront radical Islamic terrorism did. Disappointingly however, those laws passed despite the opposition voting against them. While framed as a national response, the legislation establishes a mechanism that enables firearm buybacks with tighter restrictions to be pursued by individual state governments.

What is clear is that these changes have shifted responsibility. While the Commonwealth has enacted legislation, the practical consequences now depend on decisions taken closer to home. How South

Australia responds will matter deeply to regional communities, primary producers and responsible firearm owners who already operate under some of the strictest laws in the world.

So, unless he rules out changes, law-abiding firearm owners in our regions remain squarely in the firing line.

That is why I am calling on Premier Malinauskas to rule out changes to South Australia's gun laws, and why I am asking people across Barker to sign my petition and tell the State Government to keep their hands off our guns.

Responsible, law-abiding, licensed firearm owners should never be punished for the actions of criminals or extremists. While other states have already ruled out changes, Premier Malinauskas continues to leave the door open to enforcing a gun buyback on South Australians.

In Barker, firearms are not a political talking point. From the Murray Mallee to the Barossa, from the Riverland to the Limestone Coast, firearms are essential for animal welfare, pest control, hunting and of course many people living in Barker are sporting shooters.

More red tape will not stop criminals.

It will not stop extremists. But it will



affect law-abiding people who do the right thing every day.

This is a decision the Premier can make and he must make it now before South Australians vote at the upcoming State election.

South Australians expect leadership that is firm, fair and grounded in reality. The Premier should rule out unnecessary buybacks and further restrictions that punish responsible people while doing nothing to address the extremism that led to the Bondi terror attack.
