Victoria Creek/Williamstown - why build it there?

When Thomas Adams built his sturdy and very successful hotel beside the track near Victoria Creek, there must have been a good reason to choose this site. The first title on land that became Victoria Creek was issued to George Prince in 1850. So why did Tom Adams choose that spot?

Location. It was at the crossroads from the east to west and north to south. Overlanders from the eastern states came through on the early tracks with stock and goods. It was possible to reach Adelaide via Maidstone (Kersbrook) heading south or Gawler heading west. Victoria Creek was not only a reliable watering source, but the early overlanders could follow the creek from the top of the rangers near Pewsey Vale down to what was to become Williamstown.

However, it takes more than that to make a town. In the early 1840s, land hungry men were looking for land. People such as Randall, Murray, Gilbert, Angas and Warren signed up to Special Surveys that gave them preference over thousands of acres of virgin land. They settled and started to develop their land, this took people power and families too, and so these holdings became small settlements.

Although it wasn't just about landownership, mining was a huge attraction. Unknown lands crying out to be explored, what other occupation could you wake up a pauper and go to bed as a millionaire? With the state only a few years old these optimists were out in the remote gullies trying their luck. Places that still carry the names of Sailors Gully, Kerosine Gully, Speck Gully and my favourite, Blood and Thunder Gully. Surface gold was found not in large amounts but enough to keep little communities busy.

Larger mines soon opened as men with expertise arrived, people, such as John Hammat, who was an experienced Cornish miner. They recognized the signs of copper in the ground and soon after the Wheal Friendship Mine or Ukaparinga or Unaparinga Mine and the Enterprise Mine were established in the late 1840s.

For a new state to develop it takes resources, and timber was the material of choice for building homes, wagon wheels, rail tracks, ships and wharves. Good quality wood was needed, and the Williamstown and Mt Crawford area had it in abundance. On-site sawmills were set up where the massive giants grew. The men lived on site, but they had families living in the fledgling village. All these industrious people needed homes and a community, not to mention a good pub, so Victoria Creek was the place to be. People needed blacksmiths, butchers and bakers, shops to supply their needs, a carpenter to build their homes and to supply a coffin when the time came and unfortunately it came early for some of these folk, far from a doctor or hospital. So, the dusty street became the centre of the little town as designed by Lewis Johnston, renamed Williamstown after his new son, and the rest is history.

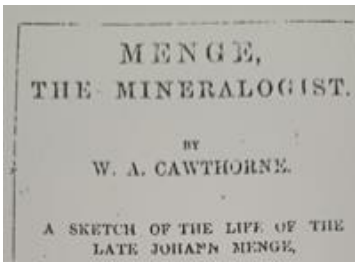
1 May - **Pulteney, Bellerophon, George Pulteney Malcolm, Borders**

This particular set is in the period before colonisation and does have a strong connection – through Malcolm Creek, and the development of the wool industry at Mount Crawford

8 May - **Menge, Mengetown and mineral wealth around Williamstown**



Johannes Menge had identified Cornflower Hill (near Mount Crawford) in his early explorations, perhaps as early as 1839, and he ended up having a scratching around for "diamonds"

15 May - **Joint Stock Cattle Company and a Tribute to Robert Rankine**



State Records

The Joint Stock Cattle Company was formed in 1838 as a very early enterprise in the infant colony - Mt Barker, Bull Creek with some stock later at Mt Crawford. Robert Rankine was employed by the Joint Stock Cattle Company, and after he left the company pursued his pastoral ventures at Mount Crawford, not long after James Coutts Crawford had a camp for his recently overlanded sheep.

Also included in this presentation will be the connections with William Coulthard and other Scottish entities and a Tribute to Robert Rankine.

22 May - **Beautiful Lyndoch Valley - Beau Ideal 1837 - 1857**

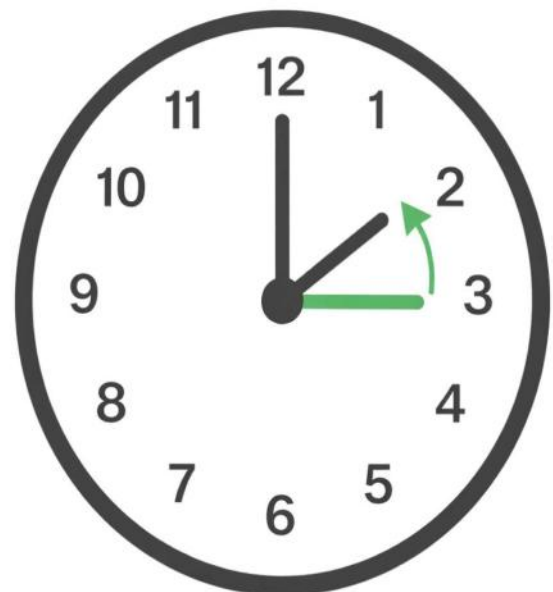
