FIRST PUBLISHED

1 JULY 1981

On June 4th 1981 a meeting was held in the Barossa District Council office at which the Lyndoch Community Council was established. Eileen Strachan was the contact person and Council members were Ian Strachan, Scott Bray, Anne Hausler, Leslie Andrews, Betty King, Mick Levin, Eileen Wiegand, Barbara Alexander and Ian Cutten.

In conjunction with this group a community newspaper funded by the Council was to be produced as part of liaising with the local community of Lyndoch. Ian Strachan became the editor and the first publication was produced on 1 July 1981 in the form of an A5 pamphlet style. It was aptly named 'Apathy Weekly Published Monthly'.

LYNDOCH'S COMMUNITY NEWS

All the name changes that took place between 1985 and 1992 were made by the Editor at the time and not through any community survey. However the last name change resulted after an editorial was put to the community in the February 1998 edition by editor, Jo Filsell, titled 'What's in a name?' This last change is the only one not to have the word 'Apathy' in its title in some form or another and was published as the August 1998 edition.

COUNCIL AMALGAMATIONS

Local Government for the Lyndoch district was proclaimed in 1854 and The District Council of Barossa West was formed followed soon after by the District Council of Barossa East.

The first amalgamation took place in 1888 when the original two Barossa Councils merged to form the District Council of Barossa.

This council under went several changes during the twentieth century. The District Council of Barossa merged with the District Council of Mt Crawford in 1935 retaining the Barossa name to become the District Council of Barossa. The members of the newly constituted council were H. Mugee (Lyndoch Ward), A. Thomas (Concordia Ward), W. Gilbert (Glen Para Ward), D. Gordon (Mt Crawford Ward), G. Warren (Williamstown Ward), and J. Barritt (Graham Ward). The council clerk was C.A. Fergusson.

Towards the end of the century a further merger took place between Barossa, Tanunda and Angaston District Councils. The super council took effect on 1st July 1996 commencing with a combined group of councillors and Ms J. Jones as CEO. As 'Barossa' was such a well renowned name, this was the automatic choice that continued the link, and The Barossa Council was established. With the addition of Mt Pleasant to the mix The Barossa Council celebrates its 30th Anniversary.



The Historical Society's next meeting will take place on Sunday 2nd August at 2.00 p.m. in the meeting room at the rear of the Lyndoch Library. The topic for the occasion is the 75th Anniversary of the celebration of the Jubilee of Federation in 1951.

Investing in wellbeing

The way we approach wellbeing and inclusion is changing in the Barossa with The Barossa Council releasing a draft four-year plan and calling on the community to have their say.

The draft Wellbeing and Inclusion Plan sets out how Council will work alongside the community over the next four years to strengthen wellbeing for everyone who lives, works and visits here. Growing from Council's Wellbeing Project and grounded in the aspirations of the Barossa Community Plan 2024-2044, the draft Plan takes a foundational approach, starting with what the community has, and asking how Council can support, strengthen and invest in it over the next four years.

Mayor Bim Lange said the draft plan is a leap forward for Council and its ongoing commitment to creating a healthier, safer and more connected community. "Wellbeing isn't something Council can deliver on its own. What we hear from the community during this consultation will shape how work is delivered," he said. "The Barossa is a place built on rela-

tionships. Across our region, people look out for each other through sporting clubs, community groups, places of faith, neighbourhood gatherings, the arts, volunteer-run services and a thousand quieter acts of care. That is the foundation we are building on."

Beyond giving Council a clear plan for action on wellbeing, the Plan fulfils Council's legal requirements under the Disability Inclusion Act 2018 (SA) and the South Australian Public Health Act 2011. The draft Plan is open for consultation with community members encouraged to have their say before 5pm, Friday 17 July. New digital space for wellbeing and connection

Knowing where to turn when you need support, a space to connect or a resource for your health and wellbeing can make all the difference, and now Barossa residents have a new digital space that does just that.

The Barossa Council has launched the Barossa Wellbeing Hub, a new digital space designed to put es-

sential information directly in the hands of people who need it most.

From local assets and community spaces to wellbeing services and support, the digital Hub brings it all together in one accessible place for the Barossa community.

The Hub is the digital home of Council's Barossa Wellbeing Project, through which Council works as a connector between services, partners and community to strengthen wellbeing across the region via the Wellbeing Network.

Mayor Bim Lange said the new website has been developed with the community in mind.

"It's about bringing everything into one centralised location, so, members of the community can find places, spaces, programs, organisations and more that support their health and wellbeing," he said.

"Ensuring the community has access to this information is important in building a connected, safe and healthy community.

"This new resource has been achieved through collaboration, and the shared information model will help strengthen our community. We're proud to create and curate this digital space where the community to access information and connect."

The launch follows two years of community engagement, co-design, and partnership development through the Barossa Wellbeing Project, which engaged more than 860 residents and organisations across the region to shape the Barossa Wellbeing and Inclusion Plan.

Mayor Lange acknowledged the contribution of Enhance Barossa Mental Health (EBMH) whose successful funding application through the Australian Government's Stronger Communities Programme helped make the Resource Hub a reality.

The new website www.wellbeingbarossa.com.au will replace the Barossa Cares website which was developed as a response to COVID to ensure the community were connected and retained access to important services.

Residents, service providers, and community organisations are encouraged to explore the hub.
