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The colourful history of mining around Williamstown

The hills East of Williamstown and around the Mt Crawford area have long held fascination for geologists, gemologists, miners and weekend fossickers. An old German geologists claims to have found almost every known gemstone in the area. Certainly, there is evidence of gold, rutile, mica, iron, beryl, feldspar and clays, plus precious gem stones. Most are of poor quality or small supply; however a few have been successfully mined.

The thought of finding a quantity of gold always gets people going, and over the years many have tried their luck in the gullies around Williamstown and Mt Crawford. While they have left little evidence of their toiling, their place names remain. There were a few successful gold discoveries in Watts Gully, Barossa Goldfield just outside our area, as was the very successful Deloraine Mine south of the South Para. The Deloraine did employ Williamstown men and we have quite a quantity of data on this mine.

Gold miners are a secretive lot and therefore we have little record of what they were finding out in the back gullies. We do know about the two copper mines near Williamstown. Copper was discovered as early as 1847-48. About three kilometers south of Williamstown the Ukaparinga or Wheal Friendship mine was establish, but there were financial restraints and it closed in 1850 when many people left for the Victorian gold rush, but it was reworked in 1876-1877. Shafts were sunk but again finance and returns were a limiting factor.

There was a similar story for the Enterprise Mine north of Williamstown, opened by John Hammat in 1847. It also had financial difficulties as it was on private property owned by Johann Mattner, but the mineral rights were owned by Marston & Webb, who lived in England. The agreement was not financially advantageous for developing and maintaining the mine profitably. Several attempts were made to resuscitate the mine but in the end it closed. It was by all accounts quite a little community, with houses, and some thirty families (re Stuart Hammat) and a church called the Providence. Another small but successful mine was the Iron Stone Mine. It was located in the bank beside the South Para River, now under the Reservoir near the spillway. Iron stone or micaceous hematite was of high grade and sort-after particularly during the Second World War (used to make machine gun bullets), so working the mine was considered essential employment for the war effort. This was managed and maintained by the Smiths, later known throughout the region as Smith Bros. Probably the most successful mine was the Clay Mine on Warren's property at Springfield, opened in 1914. It started as an underground operation but became an open cut in the early 1950s. The nature of the mineral is complex and is made up of various components. Fireclay – White kaolinised sillimanite. – used for refractories – metal moulds. Filler Clay - contains mica – used as a filler in paint, plastic, rubber, paper, floor coverings, glass, cosmetics and ink. Refractory Shale – used for brick manufacture. Closure was about late 1990 – to 2005

Restoration has taken place around the pit with substantial tree planting and the scars from quarrying are slowly healing but with still a way to go.
